#### **Interim Comment**

Anglo American Platinum's Rustenburg Base Metals Refiners (RBMR) requires reagents in support of processing applications at their Magnetic Concentrator (MC) Plant and BMR plants. The chemicals are received, stored and distributed from a centralised bulk chemical storage facility. However, continuous leaks and loss of bund integrity have resulted in the contamination of the current site's substrate resulting in heaving of the foundations. The chemical storage plant therefore needs to be relocated.

SRK Consulting (South Africa) (Pty) Ltd has been appointed by Anglo American Platinum RBMR to conduct an Environmental Authorisation Application for the proposed relocation of the bulk chemical storage facility at Anglo America Platinum's Rustenburg Base Metal Refiners, near Rustenburg, North West Province.

A draft Scoping Report (DSR) has been submitted in terms of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (NEMA) and the 2017 NEMA Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations. The proposed activities includes the construction of a new Bulk Chemical Storage Facility, paved access roads and siding on the railway.

Digby Wells Environmental has been appointed to provide heritage specialist input as required by section 24(4)b(iii) of NEMA and section 38(8) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act 25 of 1999 (NHRA).

Hardwick, S and Du Piesanie, J. 2020. Heritage Scoping Input: Heritage Resources Management Process for the Rustenburg Base Metals Refinery Bulk Chemical Storage Facility Relocation Project, North West Province.

The Heritage Scoping Input notes potential risk to heritage resources defined as section 35 and 36 heritage resources. It is recommended that an HIA be completed to assess identified heritage resources and develop specific and appropriate mitigation measures. It is further noted that no Palaeontological Assessment will be conducted as the proposed development footprint is underlain by areas of zero palaeosensitivity.

- The Scoping Report (SR) and plan of study for Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) which was submitted in terms of regulation 21 of the EIA Regulations, 2014 as amended, received by the Department on 19 January 2021, including a site inspection conducted by the Department officials Ms. Q. Imasiku and Mr. T. Loeto with Ms. V. Buitendag and Ms. B. Semenya (Anglo) together with Ms. N. Masawi from SRK Consulting (EAP) on 12 February 2021 has reference.
- 2. This Scoping Report and plan of study for EIA has been reviewed by this Department and it is hereby **accepted** in terms of Regulation 22 (a) of the EIA Regulations, 2014 as amended. However the following must be addressed in detail in the EIA Phase of this project:
  - a. An A3 layout plan showing all sensitive environmental features to be affected by the development, **if any**, and clearly indicate where each development will be located.
  - b. An A3 locality map to be included in the report.
  - c. A record of material safety data sheets (MSDS) for each chemical handled at the plant during decommissioning must be provided.





- d. Detailed Cleaning procedures of the tanks during decommissioning must be provided; procedures must be in accordance to the recommendations of the material safety data sheet of the chemicals.
- e. Environmental Impact Assessment Report which includes all specialist studies undertaken must be submitted to all other relevant authorities for comment and their comments including comments from interested and affected parties must be included in the final Environmental Impact Assessment report to be submitted to this Department for consideration.
- f. Environmental Management Programme (EMPr) An EMPr for the construction and operational phases of the project must be developed to identify and mitigate potential environmental and social impacts associated with the proposed activity on the receiving environment. The contents of the EMPr must comply with the guidelines as stipulated in Regulations 23(4) of Government Notice R.326 of 04 December 2014 as amended.
- You may accordingly proceed with undertaking the environmental impact assessment in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 23 of Government Notice No. R.326 of 04 December 2014 as amended and the tasks that are outlined above, and in the plan of study for environmental impact assessment.

It is an offense in terms of Section 24F of the National Environmental Management Act to commence with a listed activity prior to obtaining an Environmental Authorisation.

## **BULK CHEMICAL STORAGE FACILITY**

The meeting between officials from the Department of Economic Development, Environment, Conservation and Tourism (DEDECT), RBMR and SRK Consulting on 11 August 2020 has reference. The purpose of the meeting was to, *inter alia*, notify the DEDECT of the project and to request the DEDECT to issue a NEMA Section 30A directive to RBMR in declaring an emergency situation, thereby granting RBMR with permission to commence with construction of a bulk storage facility before an environmental authorisation has been issued.

The proposed project includes the decommissioning of the current bulk chemical (acid and caustic) storage tanks as well as the construction and operation of new bulk chemical (acid and caustic) storage tanks. Following the presentation and motivation submitted to the department, it is concluded that situation with the current bulk chemical storage tanks, does not meet the requirements of section 30A of the NEMA to qualify as an *emergency situation*.

This is based on the fact that RBMR has been aware of the deterioration of the current tanks as early as 2018, indicating in the report that RBMR has been implementing repairs to the plant and also appointed a specialist to implement a monitoring programme pertaining to the



tanks (namely by conducting weekly laser scanning of the bunded area) which commenced

in October 2018 (see page 10 of the motivation).

Furthermore, on page 21 of the motivation, the timeframes are stipulated by which RMBR

intends to progress with the activity of constructing new storage facilities, namely that the

start of construction is planned for March 22, 2022 and commissioning and handover on May

16, 2023 - August 07, 2023.

In light of the fact that, on your own account, it is confirmed that the construction of the

storage facility will only commence in the first quarter of 2021, your request for a directive in

terms of section 30A of the National Environmental Management Act of 1998 is not granted

as this situation does not meet the requirements as stipulated in the Act, for declaring it an

"emergency situation" which refers to a situation that has arisen *suddenly*.

In this matter RMBR was aware of the deterioration of the tanks since 2018 and planning by

RMBR for the new development is set for construction only in March 2021, resulting in the

fact that this situation cannot be regarded as a situation that has arisen suddenly. You are

therefore advised that you will have to apply for an environmental authorization as required in

terms of the legislation for the listed activities identified in your motivation and that no activity

may commence prior to an environmental authorization being granted.

The department will however, as soon as an application for environmental authorisation has

been submitted to the department, attempt to fast track the EA application process as far as

it is possible and allowed within the NEMA, although no guarantees with respect to fast

tracking and positive outcome of the process can be given.

# DRAFT SCOPING REPORT FOR THE PROPOSED RELOCATION OF THE BULK CHEMICAL STORAGE FACILITY AT ANGLO AMERICAN PLATINUM'S RUSTENBURG BASE METAL REFINERS (RBMR)

The Unit: Integrated Environmental Management acknowledges the receipt of the draft Scoping Report for the proposed relocation of the bulk chemical storage facility at Anglo American Platinum's Rustenburg Base Metal Refiners (RBMR), on Portion 42 of the farm Waterval 303 JQ.

The proposed project will include decommissioning of the current bulk chemical storage facility and construction and operation of a new bulk chemical storage facility.

The construction of the new plant and associated infrastructure will include the following:

- Construction of chemical tanks (8 for caustic soda, 2 for sulphuric acid and 2 for formalin);
- Construction of parking and weighbridge areas;
- Resurfacing of the existing gravel access road with tar for the transportation of imported chemicals; and
- Construction of a rail siding from the existing railway line to the bulk chemical storage facility for the transportation of locally acquired chemicals.

The proposed bulk storage facility will be located on the RBMR property, just outside the current RBMR boundary. The proposed plant location is owned by the applicant, RBMR. The construction and installation of the proposed bulk chemical storage facility will reduce the risk of failure of the current facility which would have environmental, socio-economic as well as health and safety implications.

The proposed development is listed in terms of National Environmental Management Act, (NEMA, Act 107 of 1998), 07 April 2017, as amended. The development triggered Regulation GNR. 983, Listing Notice 1 (GN R 327) Activity 24, 27, 31, 60 and 64) and Listing Notice 2 (GN R 325) Activity 4 and 7.

According to the Bojanala Platinum District Municipality's Environmental Management Framework (BPDM EMF, June 2020), the site is situated in Zone A: Development Zone I (Residential, business and other) and Zone C: Development Zone III (Mining).

i. Zone A: Development Zone I (Residential, business and other). 'Development Zone I' is a refinement of areas identified for future urban development in local municipal SDFs. These development uses include, amongst others, residential land uses, commercial land uses and land uses related to government functions, but specifically excludes industrial land uses and mining related land uses.

The following general management guidelines are applicable to Zone A:

- Development should be confined to urban areas (areas situated within the urban node/edge/fringe, or where no such node/edge/fringe has been defined or adopted, areas situated within the edge of built-up areas) to minimise the effects of urban sprawl in the area.
- The zone should be used for the expansion of urban areas and the integration of existing settlements.
- Green open spaces should be established and protected within the zone.
- The following should be encouraged in this zone:
  - o Urban infill development;
  - o Residential development;
  - o Commercial developments;
  - o Government functions;
  - o Other appropriate land uses as reflected in the applicable SDF/s;
  - o Upgrading of service infrastructure; and
  - o Urban greening
- If the zone falls within a Biosphere Buffer Zone, the following guidelines are also applicable:
  - The development guidelines in the relevant management plan should be consulted whenever an activity falls within the buffer area.
  - Developments that might put stress on the protected environments should be avoided within the buffer area.
  - o The applicable biosphere development guidelines and principles should be considered.
  - Conservation and tourism orientated developments should be promoted within the buffer area.
  - High density developments, industrial developments, mining activities and other highimpact developments should be avoided in the buffer area.
- ii. Zone C: Development Zone III (Mining). The 'Development Zone III (Mining) is a refinement of areas identified in local municipal SDFs as areas with potential for mining development. If developed in a sustainable manner, these areas have the potential to stimulate economic growth in the area.

## General environmental management guidelines

The following general management guidelines are applicable to Zone C:

- Mining activities should, as far as possible, be confined to Zone C.
- Mining activities should be conducted in a sustainable manner.
- Wetlands, areas in proximity to aquatic features, areas of high or sensitive biodiversity, and areas of sensitive topography should be avoided at all costs.
- If the zone falls within a Biosphere Buffer Zone, the following guidelines are also applicable:
  - The development guidelines in the relevant management plan should be consulted whenever an activity falls within the buffer area.
  - Developments that might put stress on the protected environments should be avoided within the buffer area.
  - o The applicable biosphere development guidelines and principles should be considered.
  - Conservation and tourism orientated developments should be promoted within the buffer area.
  - High density developments, industrial developments, mining activities and other highimpact developments should be avoided in the buffer area.

According to Zone A: Development Zone I (Residential, business and other) and Zone C: Development Zone III (Mining), the land use listed above is compatible and partially compatible, as per the above-mentioned Zones, however, the proposed projects activities will be located within the RBMR operations, which has already been impacted by mining activities.

In light of the above and the information submitted, please note that the Unit: Integrated Environmental Management support the proposed relocation of the bulk chemical storage facility at Anglo American Platinum's Rustenburg Base Metal Refiners (RBMR).
