1 Introduction

Natref Petroleum Refiners of South Africa (Proprietary) Limited (“Natref”) is South Africa’s only inland crude refinery, located in Sasolburg, in the northern part of the Free State Province. Natref is jointly owned by Sasol and Total. Natref has applied for postponement from compliance timeframes in terms of Regulation 11 of the Section 21 of the NEM:AQA Minimum Emissions Standards for their operation in Sasolburg.

Natref’s applications include the findings of an independently prepared Atmospheric Impact Report (AIR), which determines Natref’s impact on ambient air quality, along with further reasons that warrant consideration in a decision about postponements or exemptions from the MES. Natref has appointed Airshed Planning Professionals (Airshed) to prepare the AIR and SRK Consulting (SRK) to manage the technical studies and the associated stakeholder engagement.

1.1 Scope of this report

This report documents the stakeholder engagement activities undertaken during the announcement phase, as well during the second phase where stakeholders had the opportunity to comment on the Draft Motivation Reports prepared for Natref’s operation in Sasolburg.

2 Approach to stakeholder engagement

Natref has structured its public participation process in support of postponement applications along the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) regulations published under the National Environmental Management Act (Act 107 of 1998) (NEMA), as specified in the November 2013 Minimum Emissions Standards (MES) regulations.




Figure 2-1: Technical and Stakeholder Engagement Process

The stakeholder engagement process is an important component of the application process and is closely linked to the technical steps and activities required in the preparation of Motivation Reports (**Figure 2-1**).

The initial stakeholder engagement process comprised two rounds of engagement; public meetings that took place during the announcement phase and a second round of public meetings and focus group meetings that took place when the Draft Motivation Reports were made available for public comment.

Since the conclusion of the initial stakeholder engagement process in June 2014, the Minister of Environmental Affairs has formally notified Natref that she will not consider its exemption applications, and has advised that postponement applications should be made instead. Natref will therefore submit its previous exemption applications as additional postponement applications. While the additional applications contain materially the same content as the original exemption applications, a further opportunity will be provided to stakeholders to comment on these as additional postponement applications.

The final postponement applications that have not been affected by the Minister’s notification were submitted to the National Air Quality Officer (NAQO) for decision-making in September 2014. Stakeholders were notified that their comments on final postponement applications could be submitted directly to the NAQO.

3 Stakeholder Identification

Stakeholders identified in previous environmental authorisation processes undertaken by SRK, together with lists of stakeholders that Natref has regular contact with, networking and referral formed the basis for the development of the stakeholder database.

The stakeholder database for the Natref operation comprised 82 stakeholders, representing various sectors of society as per the examples below. Refer to **Annexure 1** for the full database of stakeholders:


- National government: Such as The Department of Environment Affairs (DEA), Department on Mineral Resources (DMR) and the Department of Water Affairs (DWA).
- Provincial government: Such as the Free State Department of Economic Development Tourism and Environmental Affairs (FDEDET), Health and Social Development, Water Affairs and the South African Local Government Association (SALGA).
- District and local government: Fezile Dabe District Municipality, Metsimaholo Local Municipality and their ward councillors.
- NGOs and interest groups: Such as Save the Vaal Environment, the Vaal Environmental Alliance (VEJA), Wildlife and Environment Society of South Africa (WESSA), Legal Resources Centre (LRC), Centre for Environmental Rights (CER) and GroundWork.
- Organised business and commerce: Business Unity South Africa (BUSA).
- Organised mining and industry: Chamber of Mines.
- Community based organisations: Sasol Community Working Group.
- Labour unions and associations: Transvaal Agricultural Union (TAUSA), National Education Health and Allied Workers' Union (NEWAHU).
- Research and academia: Council for Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) and Infotox.
- Media: Sedibeng Ster, Vaal Weekblad.
- Parastatals: Eskom, Transnet, Telkom and the South African National Biodiversity Institute (SANBI).
- Natref employees (internal stakeholders).
- Adjacent and surrounding landowners.

The database also includes a list of registered I&APs (see **Annexure 2**) as per the requirement in Chapter 6, (55.1) specified in NEMA. The stakeholder database was reviewed throughout the stakeholder engagement process.

4 Project announcement

The project announcement phase was conducted between **15 September and 15 October 2013**. Stakeholders were invited to attend a public meeting in Sasolburg and were notified of this meeting as follows:

- Distribution by email and mail, of invitation letters accompanied by a Background Information Document (BID), and Registration and Comment Form in English, Afrikaans and Sesotho (see **Annexure 3** for copies of these documents).
- Advertisements in two national newspapers (see **Annexure 4**) to announce the application process:
 - Sunday Times (English), Sunday, 15 September 2013.
 - Beeld (Afrikaans), Tuesday, 17 September 2013.
- Advertisements in local newspapers (see **Annexure 4**):
 - Sasolburg Ster (English), Wednesday, 18 September 2013.
 - Puisano (Sesotho), Friday, 20 September 2013.
 - Vaal Weekblad (Afrikaans), Wednesday, 18 September 2013.
- Erecting four A2 sites notices at the Natref site offices. (Refer to **Annexure 4** for a copy of the site notice. The locations of the site notice are shown in **Figure 4-1** below).
- Posting the BID, invitation letter and Comment Forms on the SRK website (www.srk.co.za).
- Placing the BID, invitation letter and Comment Forms in publicly accessible venues close to the Natref operation, namely the Sasolburg public library and at the reception office at Metsimaholo Local Municipality. (Refer to the location of public places in **Figure 4-1**.
- Telephonic and SMS notifications to stakeholders to inform them of the opportunity to comment and to remind them of the public meeting.

4.1 Public Meeting

The public meeting for the Natref operation was held on Tuesday, 8 October 2013, between 10:00 and 12:00, at the Boiketlong Community Hall in Sasolburg. The primary objectives of the first round of stakeholder engagement were to:

- Provide I&APs with background information on Natref's application process and associated stakeholder engagement.
- Outline the application process and opportunities for comment.
- Introduce the SRK, Airshed and Natref team members to stakeholders.

In addition to the BIDs distributed electronically and by mail with the invitation letters, made available at public places, 60 BIDs and comment forms were distributed during the Natref public meeting. Please refer to **Table 4-1**.

A PowerPoint presentation in English, based on the information contained in the BID, was used to present information to stakeholders during the public meeting. Afrikaans and Sesotho interpreters were present to assist with the communication process.

Four stakeholders representing authorities, business and industry, and community based organisations from the Zamdela community attended the public meeting. The meeting list is included in **Annexure 5**.

4.2 Opportunities for comment

In addition to the opportunities to comment verbally at the public meeting, stakeholders were encouraged to submit their written comments in a Comment Form to team members present at the meeting, using the comment form enclosed with the BID.

Stakeholders could also contact the SRK stakeholder engagement team via telephone, email or fax to submit comments, and to discuss any issues of concern.

One written comment and 0 email submissions were received during the comment period.

4.3 Key issues raised by stakeholders during announcement

The key comments, concerns and suggestions raised by stakeholders for the Natref operation are summarised below:

- **Comments relating to Natref's application process** - Stakeholders' comments focused on Natref's reasons for applying for postponement, legal requirements, timeframe for compliance and requests for details regarding which processes require postponement.
- **Stakeholder engagement** - It was noted that the BID did not provide sufficient information for meaningful stakeholder comment. Stakeholders commented on the poor attendance at the public meeting and made suggestions for more convenient venues and meeting times. Some stakeholders requested an extended public comment period.
- It was requested that the Sasol Community Group be notified well in advance of the public meeting to enable Zamdela Community attendance.
- **Environmental concerns** - Stakeholders expressed concern regarding Natref's air emissions and actual contribution to air pollution in the area. Other environmental concerns regarding the impact of Natref's emissions on water quality, health and socio-economic aspects, such as Natref's obligation to re-invest in communities in their area of operation, and to empower communities to care for the environment, were also raised.

5 Public Comment on the Draft Motivation Report

It was anticipated that the draft Motivation Report would be made available for public comment in January or February 2014. However, due to the amendment of the Minimum Emissions Standards (MES) in November 2013, the schedule for the availability of the report was affected. A feedback letter was distributed by mail, email and fax (in English) in January 2014, to notify stakeholders of the schedule change. This letter was available in Afrikaans and isiZulu on request. Refer to the letter in **Annexure 6**.

Due to the fact that the public meeting held during the first round of stakeholder engagement was poorly attended, despite reasonable efforts, it was proposed to hold a focus group meeting with key stakeholders in addition to a public meeting during the second round of engagement. This was to encourage greater stakeholder participation in the application process.

The primary objectives of the second round of engagement were to:

- Provide stakeholders with the opportunity to discuss and comment on the Draft Motivation Report.
- Ensure that stakeholder views and comments recorded in the announcement phase have been recorded and understood.
- Provide information on the way forward in the application process.

Stakeholders received notification of the public meeting and were invited to comment on the Draft Motivation Reports during the comment period from **15 April to 13 June 2014**, as follows:

- Distribution by email and mail, of an invitation letter to attend a public meeting, accompanied by a Comment Form in English. These documents were available in Afrikaans and Sesotho upon request (**Annexure 7**).
- Posting the letter, Comment Form and the draft Motivation Reports on the SRK website (www.srk.co.za).
 - Placing the letter, Comment Form and the Draft Motivation Reports in publicly accessible venues close to the Natref operation, as during the announcement phase.
- Advertisements in two national newspapers to announce the availability of the Draft Motivation Report for public comment: (**Annexure 8**):
 - Sunday Times (English), Sunday 30 March 2014.
 - Beeld (Afrikaans), Tuesday 1 April 2014.
- Advertisements in local newspapers: (**Annexure 8**):
 - Sasolburg Ster (English), Wednesday, 2 April 2014.
 - Puisano (Sesotho), Friday, 11 April 2014.
 - Vaal Weekblad (Afrikaans), Wednesday, 2 April 2014.
- Telephonic and SMS notifications were sent stakeholders to inform them of the opportunities to comment.

5.1 Public Meeting

The public meeting for the Natref operation was held on Tuesday, 20 May 2014, between 14:00 and 16:00, at Casa Mia Conference Centre in Sasolburg.

In addition to invitation letters distributed via email, the letters, comment forms and Draft Motivation Report were made available at public places. Forty comment forms and 10 CD copies of the report were made available to stakeholders at the public meeting.

A PowerPoint presentation in English, based on the information contained in the Draft Motivation Report, was used to present information to stakeholders during the public meeting.

In addition to the Natref staff and project team members, eleven stakeholders representing authorities, residents, landowners and business and industry attended the public meeting. The meeting list is included in **Annexure 9**.

5.2 Additional invitation for additional Focus Group Meeting with key stakeholders

An additional invitation was extended to representatives of certain key stakeholders such as NGOs and local and provincial government to participate in an additional meeting with the Natref project team to clarify any technical questions or comments they may have on Natref's applications and reports. These organisations have not requested an additional clarification meeting with the Natref project team.

5.3 Key issues raised by stakeholders during public comment on Draft Motivation Reports

The key comments, concerns and suggestions raised by stakeholders at the Natref public meeting are summarised below:

- **Application process** - Stakeholders were of the opinion that Natref had the opportunity to provide inputs into the MES in 2010 and that they should now comply with it. Certain stakeholders felt that Natref had no legal basis to apply for postponement.
- **Environmental concerns** – Questions were raised as to how Natref was going to mitigate its greenhouse emissions and assist government in meeting its climate change response plan. It was also requested that the data presented in the Air Impact Modelling Report should be verified. Some stakeholders rejected the idea of offsetting as they felt that it was governments' responsibility to improve housing and insulation. They noted that industry was using offsetting as an excuse for non-compliance with the MES.

Questions were asked regarding the differences between the impacts of Sasol and Natref's on the environments and it was noted that the different presentations regarding Sasol and Natref created suspicion. Some stakeholders were of the opinion that postponements from the MES should not be granted for Natref as there was no legal basis for their application, and that Natref has not addressed the adverse health impacts of their operation. Applications have not been submitted within the appropriate time of the compliance date and postponement should not be allowed for hazardous air pollutants such as PM and other hazardous emissions.

- **Stakeholder engagement** – Stakeholders noted that the information given in the presentations was too technical for the general public to understand fully and said that more effort should have been put in to explain complex terms to stakeholders in general as well as to surrounding communities. Questions were raised as to how stakeholders were to provide comment on

reports when it is stated in the draft motivation reports that it was a criminal offence to publish any part of the document without written consent of the author.

6 Way forward on application process

Stakeholders were informed in writing (email, fax, post) (**Appendix 10**) that the Minister of Environmental Affairs formally notified Natref that she would not consider its exemption applications, and advised that postponement applications should be made instead. In line with the Minister's notification, Natref will submit the following to the NAQO for decision-making:

- Final postponement applications that have not been affected by the Ministers' notification.
- Previous exemption applications as additional postponement applications.

7 Notification of public comment on draft Motivation Reports in support of additional postponement applications

Stakeholders were invited to comment on the Additional Postponement Applications which were available for public for 40 days from **Monday 13 October to Friday 21 November 2014**, as follows:

- Distribution by email, mail and fax of an availability letter, accompanied by a Comment Form in English. These documents were available in Afrikaans and Sesotho upon request (**Annexure 11**).
- Posting the letter, Comment Form and the additional postponement application on the SRK website www.srk.co.za.
- Advertisements in local newspapers to announce the availability of the Draft Additional Postponement Applications for public comment (**Annexure 12**):
 - Sasolburg Ster (English), Wednesday 8 October 2014.
 - Puisano (Sesotho), Wednesday 8 October 2014.
 - Vaal Weekblad (Afrikaans), Wednesday 8 October 2014.

8 Notification of submission of final additional postponement applications

Stakeholders were notified in writing (mail, email and fax) that the final additional postponement applications have been submitted to the NAQO for decision-making and that comments on the reports can be submitted directly to the NAQO within 21 days. Final Motivation Reports were made available electronically for stakeholder's information on the SRK website www.srk.co.za, or on request from the stakeholder engagement office.

9 Comment and Response Report

All comments, concerns, questions and suggestions raised during the Natref public meeting, as well as any written comments received from stakeholders have been recorded in the Comment and Response Report (CRR). The CRR provides a consolidated record of stakeholder comments as well as responses from the SRK, Airshed and Natref project team members. The CRR is attached in the Motivation Report as **Annexure D**.

10 Conclusion

Contributions to Natref's application process by a wide range of stakeholders will ensure that the relevant aspects and issues raised and reflected in the CRR are considered as part of the authority decision-making process.

While a number of Natref's process emissions will comply with the MES, there are some that cannot meet the standards within the required timeframes, and others which are unlikely to meet the standards at all. Natref therefore intends to apply for either postponements or exemptions from the MES in these specific cases.

Natref's applications will include the findings of an independently prepared Atmospheric Impact Report (AIR), which will determine the refinery's impact on ambient air quality, along with further reasons that warrant consideration in a decision about postponements or exemptions from the MES. To achieve this, Natref has appointed Airshed Planning Professionals to prepare the Atmospheric Impact Report and SRK Consulting to manage the technical studies and the required stakeholder engagement process.

INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this document is to provide stakeholders with the following:

- Information on the background to Natref's applications for postponements or exemptions from the requirements of the National Environmental Management: Air Quality Act No 39 of 2004 (NEMAQA) – Section 21 Minimum Emission Standards (MES) (published in GNR No. 248 of 31 March 2010) for the Natref facility in Sasolburg.
- An outline of the legal framework governing air quality management in South Africa and specifically NEMAQA Section 21 listed activities, pertinent to this BID and related applications.
- Natref's high level reasons for requesting postponement from Compliance Timeframes and exemptions for selected NEMAQA Section 21 listed activities.
- Information on the stakeholder engagement and application process that will be followed.
- Opportunity to provide comments relating to the application.

BACKGROUND TO NATREF

Natref is South Africa's only inland crude refinery and refines heavy crude oil. The Natref operation in Sasolburg is jointly owned by Sasol and Total. Natref is required to comply with the Minimum Emission Standards (MES) as described below.

Natref is located in Sasolburg in the Metsimaholo local municipality which is part of the Fezile Dabi District Municipality in the Free State Province.




BACKGROUND TO NATREF

Air quality management

The term “ambient air quality” refers to the state of the air in our surrounding environment. Good air quality is important not only for humans, but for other organisms and the environment in general. Poor air quality is a result of a number of factors, including emissions from various sources, both natural (such as veld fires) and “human-induced” (industrial and domestic emissions).

The role of the authorities is to ensure that ambient air quality meets standards set to protect human health and the environment. In order to achieve this, the Department of Environmental Affairs has promulgated two related but distinct standards. The first are referred to as minimum emission standards, which place limits on the concentration of emissions from certain industrial activities. The second are ambient air quality standards which seek to set total emissions from all contributors (i.e. industry, citizens and natural causes) to a level that protects human health and the environment.



Natref's approach to air quality management

Natref's approach to air quality management is well aligned with the risk-based philosophy adopted by the ambient air quality standards.

Natref prepares dispersion model scenarios to understand its impacts on ambient air quality in the region in which it operates, and its capacity to improve these outcomes with emission reduction technologies. This is contextualised against the backdrop of other sources of ambient air pollution, to identify the most effective actions to achieve ambient air quality improvements. This approach helps to inform Natref's air quality management priorities, by identifying the key actions to effectively improve ambient air quality.

BACKGROUND TO AIR QUALITY MANAGEMENT LEGISLATION IN SOUTH AFRICA

Constitution

Section 24 of the Constitution, specifically the Bill of Rights, stipulates that:

“Everyone has the right to an environment that is not harmful to their health or well-being; and to have the environment protected, for the benefit of present and future generations, through reasonable legislative and other measures that:

- *Prevent pollution and ecological degradation;*
- *Promote conservation; and*
- *Secure ecologically sustainable development and use of natural resources while promoting justifiable economic and social development.”*

National Framework for Air Quality Management

The National Framework for Air Quality Management in the Republic of South Africa (11 September 2007) provides a guideline to the interpretation and application of the NEMAQA, and has been developed to assist the responsible parties to achieve the objectives and regulations set out in the Act. The framework includes mechanisms, systems and procedures to attain compliance with ambient air quality standards, including an outline of the process required to set point source emission standards.

NEMAQA

In keeping with the Bill of Rights, this constitutional right the National Environmental Management: Air Quality Act No 39 of 2004 (NEMAQA) was enacted on the 24 February 2005. One of the objectives of NEMAQA is “generally to give effect to (that right) in order to enhance the quality of ambient air for the sake of securing an environment that is not harmful to the health and well-being of people”. It aims to “provide reasonable measures for the prevention of pollution and ecological degradation and for securing ecologically sustainable development while promoting justifiable economic and social development”.

In order to achieve its stated objectives, the NEMAQA provides for various specific air quality management measures. These include the declaration of priority areas such as the Vaal Triangle Priority Area and the Highveld Priority Area, ambient air quality standards and Minimum Emission Standards as published in GNR No. 248 31 March 2010 (MES).

Section 59(1) of NEMAQA allows any person to apply for exemption from a provision of the Act. This application must be made to the Minister of the Department of Environmental Affairs. The applicant must provide reasons for the application and must take steps, as may be required, to bring it to the attention of relevant organs of state, interested persons and the public. This includes publication of a notice in two national newspapers.

Minimum Emission Standards

Section 21 of the NEMAQA provides for the listing of activities that must be licensed in accordance with the MES, published in GN 248 of 2010. The MES prescribe the limits for point source emissions from existing plants that must be met by 1 April 2015 (the so-called ‘old plant standards’ for existing plants), as well as more stringent limits that must be met by 1 April 2020 (the so-called ‘new plant standards’ for existing plants) (termed “Compliance Timeframes”).

Exemptions under NEMAQA

Section 59(1) of NEMAQA allows any person to apply for exemption from a provision of the Act. This application must be made to the Minister of the Department of Environmental Affairs. The applicant must provide reasons for the application and must take steps, as may be required, to bring it to the attention of relevant organs of state, interested persons and the public. This includes publication of a notice in two national newspapers.

Postponements under NEMAQA

Section 6 of the MES permits applications for postponements of the compliance time frames. These applications must be made to the National Air Quality Officer at the Department of Environmental Affairs. As part of its application, Natref is required to submit an Atmospheric Impact Report (AIR) and detailed justification and reasons. Postponement applications must be announced by way of notice in at least one newspaper circulating in the area affected by the plant.

NATREF'S APPLICATION

Natref operates various processes that require Atmospheric Emission Licences, some of which will comply with the MES.

Those processes involving emissions that cannot comply with the standards are being divided into separate applications, namely:

- Postponement applications - for processes involving emissions which cannot meet the 2015 deadline for existing plants but which are expected to be able to meet the emission standards within 5 years of this date.
- Exemption applications - for processes involving emissions which are unlikely to meet the emission standards at any time in the future.

The applications will take into consideration the findings of an independently prepared Atmospheric Impact Report (AIR), which will determine Natref's impact on ambient air quality in the area affected by its facility, together with a number of other reasons, described below, that warrant consideration in a decision about postponements or exemptions from the MES. Where exemptions are sought, Natref will present substantive information based on its studies that will enable the authorities to prescribe alternative standards linked to Natref's ambient impact, and that will result in improved ambient air quality based on Natref's ability to meet these. Natref will also continue to explore abatement technologies for further improvement in its air emissions in line with its continuous improvement philosophy.

The postponement and exemption applications will be separated because they are subject to different requirements under NEMAQA: postponements are regulated under Regulation 6 of the MES, while exemptions are regulated under Section 59 of the Act.

CLEAN FUELS 2

South African refineries are in the process of implementing new fuel specifications, as prescribed by the Department of Energy. The intention of the specifications is for local fuel refineries to produce fuel that has lower sulfur content. This process is widely referred to Clean Fuels 2 by the fuel refining industry. It will reduce sulphur-based emissions from petrol and diesel combustion in motor vehicles by 98%.

In order for Natref to meet the proposed specifications, changes to their process and plant will be required and this may affect their point source emissions. Further information on how the emissions will be affected will be provided in the motivation documents.

The following emissions are being contemplated in the AIR:

- Sulfur dioxide (SO₂)
- Particulate matter (PM)

NATREF'S REASONS FOR APPLYING FOR SELECTED POSTPONEMENTS OF COMPLIANCE TIMEFRAMES & EXEMPTIONS

There are various reasons, including those listed below, which make abatement to the emission levels within the Compliance Timeframes prescribed by the MES challenging in some cases and reasonably impracticable in others. These reasons will be detailed for each process in the motivation for postponements or exemptions that will be submitted to the National Air Quality Officer and Minister respectively.

- **Holistic case for point source abatement** – Natref's ongoing assessment of air quality issues around its plants suggests that the MES will not necessarily yield significant improvements in ambient air quality, due to the material impact of activities such as domestic coal and wood burning, which elevates criteria pollutant concentrations during the cold winter months. Thus high cost on-site investments are unlikely to materially improve air quality in the Vaal Triangle Priority Area, where Natref operates. Environmental management must be integrated, acknowledging that all elements of the environment are linked and interrelated, and it must take in to account the effects of decisions on all aspects of the environment by selecting "best practicable environmental options", which are the options that provide the most benefit or causes the least damage to environment as a whole, at a cost acceptable to society
- **Integrated benefits of Clean Fuels 2 programme** – The Clean Fuels 2 programme, among other benefits, reduces sulphur dioxide, particulate matter and nitrogen oxide emissions from vehicle exhausts, which has a beneficial impact on ambient air quality in urban areas. In order to reduce vehicle exhaust emissions, increased emissions result at the refinery's stack, but from a net impact perspective, ambient air quality will still be better off as a result of Clean Fuels 2.

- **Environmental trade-offs** – Improvements in air quality often require trade-offs which involve other negative environmental outcomes, and hence need to be considered more thoroughly in the context of integrated environmental management. Since Natref is unique in being an inland refinery, its effluent must be released to fresh water sources, as opposed to the sea, as with coastal refineries. Further reduction of sulphur dioxide emissions translates into increased levels of effluent or solid wastes. This runs counter to national policy imperatives on water and waste management and introduces unintended environmental impacts which must be balanced against air quality improvement objectives.
- **Space constraints** – The space available at Natref's facility has been optimised over decades of plant operations, expansions and improvements. This means that in some cases very little space is available for the installation of additional bulky abatement technology, where meeting the full requirements of the MES would require portions of the plant to be decommissioned and moved to a new site or replaced entirely. This would result in prohibitively costly upgrades to an existing plant.
- **Financial** – Natref operates in a regulated price market. Without cost recovery to implement abatement technology to meet new plant standards at Natref's existing facilities, the remaining economic lifetime of the facility may be materially affected. The socio-economic consequences of this need to be considered.
- **Retrofitting existing plants to new plant standards** – Standard equipment installed on newer plants may not perform to the same levels when installed on existing plants, due to operational and design differences in old equipment.
- **Project implementation timeframes** – The execution of major capital projects, as required for compliance with the MES, requires several years to complete. In the same timeframe, Natref is required to implement major capital projects for the purposes of meeting Clean Fuels 2 obligations. This simultaneous requirement places great strain on project resources and resource availability, and would have an impact on the petroleum refineries' shutdown timing requirements, potentially placing inland fuel security at risk. Implementing Clean Fuels 2 in the same timeframe as the MES is considered infeasible.

Interested and affected parties will be given an opportunity to comment on these aspects of the draft motivation report during the stakeholder engagement process.


APPLICATION PROCESS

Natref's approach

Natref has appointed a team of independent specialists to assist with the applications. SRK Consulting (Pty) Ltd has been appointed to undertake the stakeholder engagement process. Airshed Planning Professionals (Pty) Ltd has been appointed to prepare the AIR. Natref will appoint an independent fourth party as peer reviewer to comment on the air dispersion modelling approach, given the requirements for the postponements and exemptions application.

In addition to the newspaper notices required to be published, Natref is committed to providing stakeholders with the opportunity to provide their comment during the application process. This process has been informed, as far as practicable, by the requirements for consultation in terms of the National Environmental Management Act Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations. Responses to comments received during the stakeholder engagement process will be submitted together with the Motivation Report.

The proposed technical and stakeholder engagement activities, as well as the broad timeframes for roll out of these processes are shown below.



Content of the Motivation Reports

The Motivation Report will include detail on the specific applications for postponements from Compliance Timeframes and/or exemptions, and the reasons for them.

The Motivation Report for both exemption and postponement applications will, amongst other things, be informed by the AIR as required in terms of section 6 of the MES to support such applications. The Motivation Report will be submitted, together with a report containing all the comments received from stakeholders, to the Minister of the Department of Environmental Affairs (DEA) and the National Air Quality Officer (NAQO) for consideration.

INLEIDING



- ‘n Uiteensetting van die wetlike raamwerk wat luggehalte in Suid-Afrika beheer en spesifiek NEM:AQA Artikel 21 se gelyste aktiwiteite, wat van toepassing is op hierdie AID en verwante aansoeke.
- Natref se hoë vlak redes vir die aansoek om uitstel van die voldoeningstydraamwerke en vrystelling van sekere NEMAQA Artikel 21 gelyste aktiwiteite.

NATREF SE AGTERGROND

Natref is Suid-Afrika se enigste ruolie raffinadery in die binneland en raffineer swaar ruolie. Die Natref operasie in Sasolburg word gesamentlik besit deur Sasol en Total. Van Natref word verwag om te voldoen aan die Minimum Emissie Standaarde (MES) soos hieronder beskryf.

Natref is geleë in Sasolburg in die Metsimaholo Munisipaliteit wat deel vorm van die Fezile Dabi Distrik-munisipaliteit in die Vrystaat Provincie.



Luggehaltebestuur

Die term "omliggende luggehalte" verwys na die gehalte van lug in die omringende omgewing. Goeie luggehalte is belangrik, nie net vir mense nie, maar ook vir ander organismes en die omgewing in die algemeen. Swak luggehalte is die gevolg van 'n aantal faktore, soos emissies van verskeie bronne: beide "natuurlik" (soos veldbrande) en "mensgemaak" (soos industriële en huishoudelike emissies).

Die rol van die owerhede is om te verseker dat die luggehalte voldoen aan die standaarde wat daar gestel is om menslike gesondheid en die omgewing te beskerm. Die Departement van Omgewingsake het daarom twee verwante, maar afsonderlike standaarde gepromulgeer. Die eerste word 'n puntbron emissiestandaard genoem (of 'n minimum emissiestandaard), wat beperkings plaas op die konsentrasie van emissies van sekere industriële aktiwiteite. Dit word vervat in Artikel 21 gelyste aktiwiteite, soos in die Inleiding beskryf. Die tweede is omliggende luggehaltestandaarde wat ten doel het om standaarde daar te stel vir totale emissies van alle bydraers (i.e. industrieë, landsburgers en natuurlike oorsake) tot 'n vlak wat menslike gesondheid en die omgewing beskerm.



Natref se benadering tot Omgewingsbestuur

Natref se benadering tot die bestuur van luggehalte is in lyn met die risiko gebaseerde filosofie wat deur die omliggende luggehalte standaarde aanvaar is.

Natref berei dispersie model scenarios voor om sy impak op omliggende luggehalte te verstaan in die gebied waarin sy bedrywigheid voorkom, asook sy kapasiteit om die resultate te verbeter deur middel van emissie verminderingsstegnologie. Dit word geplaas binne die konteks van ander bronne van omliggende lugbesoedeling, om sodoende die mees effektiewe aksies te identifiseer om verbeterings aan omliggende luggehalte te bereik. Hierdie benadering help om Natref se prioriteite ten opsigte van die bestuur van omliggende luggehalte te bepaal.

AGTERGROND TOT WETGEWING RAKENDE LUGGEHALTE BESTUUR IN SUID-AFRIKA

Die Grondwet

Artikel 24 van Die Grondwet, spesifiek die Handves van Menseregte, bepaal dat:

"Almal die reg het tot 'n omgewing wat nie skadelik vir hul gesondheid of welstand is nie; en om hul omgewing te laat beskerm tot voordeel van huidige en toekomstige geslagte, deur middel van billike wetlike en ander maatreëls wat:

- Besoedeling en ekologiese agteruitgang voorkom;
- Natuurbewaring bevorder; en
- Volhoubare ekologiese ontwikkeling en gebruik van natuurlike hulpbronne verseker, terwyl regverdigbare ekonomiese en sosiale ontwikkeling bevorder word".

Nasionale Raamwerk vir Luggehaltebestuur

Die Nasionale Raamwerk vir Luggehaltebestuur in die Republiek van Suid-Afrika (11 September 2007) verskaf 'n riglyn vir die interpretasie en toepassing van die NEM:AQA, en is ontwikkel om betrokke partye by te staan om aan die doelwitte en vereistes van die regulasies, soos in die wet uiteengesit, te voldoen. Die raamwerk sluit mechanismes, sisteme en procedures in wat aan die omliggende lugkwaliteitstandaarde moet voldoen, en sluit 'n raamwerk in van die proses wat vereis word vir die daarstelling van puntbron emissiestandaarde.

NEMAQA

In ooreenstemming met die Handves van Menseregte, is die NEMAQA uitgevaardig op 24 Februarie 2005. Een van die doelwitte van die wet is *"om in die algemeen uitvoering te gee (aan die reg) om die kwaliteit van die omliggende luggehalte te verbeter om sodoende 'n omgewing te waarborg wat nie skadelik vir die gesondheid en welstand van mense sal wees nie". Dit het ten doel "om redelike maatreëls daar te stel vir die voorkoming van besoedeling en ekologiese agteruitgang, en vir die versekering van ekologies volhoubare ontwikkeling, terwyl dit regverdigbare ekonomiese en sosiale ontwikkeling bevorder."*

NEMAQA maak voorsiening vir verskeie spesifieke luggehalte bestuursmaatreëls. Dit sluit die verklaring van prioriteitsareas, soos die Vaaldriehoek en die Hoëveld Prioriteitsarea se omliggende luggehalte standarde en puntbron emissies in, soos gepubliseer in die GNR Nr. 248, van 31 Maart 2010.

Minimum Emissies Standaarde

Artikel 21 van die NEMAQA maak voorsiening vir die lys van aktiwiteite wat gelisensiéer moet word ingevolge MES, soos gepubliseer in die GN 248 van 2010. Die MES skryf perke vir puntbron emissies voor waaraan bestaande aanlegte moet voldoen teen 1 April 2015 (die sogenaamde 'ou aanleg standarde' vir bestaande aanlegte), sowel as strenger standarde waaraan voldoen moet word teen 1 April 2020 (sogenaamde 'nuwe aanleg standarde' vir bestaande aanlegte) (bekend as "Voorgeskrewe Voldoeningstydraamwerke").

Vrystellings in terme van NEMAQA

Artikel 59(1) van NEMAQA maak voorsiening vir enige persoon om aansoek te doen vir vrystelling van 'n bepaling van die Wet. Hierdie aansoek moet aan die Minister van Omgewingsake gerig word. Die aansoeker moet redes vir die aansoek voorsien en moet die nodige stappe neem om die aansoek onder die aandag van betrokke regeringsorganisasies, belanghebbende persone en die publiek te bring. Dit sluit die publikasie van 'n kennisgewing in twee nasionale koerante in.

Uitstel in terme van NEMAQA

Artikel 6 van die MES maak voorsiening vir aansoek om uitstel van die Tydraamwerk van Voldoening. Hierdie aansoeke moet aan die Nasionale Luggehalte Beample by die Departement van Omgewingsake voorgelê word. As deel van die aansoek, is Natref verplig om 'n Atmosferiese Impak Verslag (AIV) in te dien, asook gedetailleerde regverdiging en redes vir die aansoek. Kennis moet gegee word van aansoeke vir uitstel deur die plasing van 'n kennisgewing in ten minste een koerant in die area wat deur die aanleg geaffekteer word.

NATREF SE AANSOEK

Natref bedryf verskillende prosesse wat Atmosferiese Emissie Licensies vereis waarvan sommige nie sal voldoen aan die MES nie.

Die prosesse wat emissies behels wat nie aan die standarde sal kan voldoen nie, word in verskillende aansoeke verdeel, naamlik:

- Uitstelaansoeke – vir prosesse wat emissies behels wat nie die 2015 sperdatum vir bestaande aanlegte sal haal nie, maar waar daar verwag word dat hulle sal kan voldoen aan die emissie standarde binne die volgende 5 jaar van hierdie datum.
- Vrystellingsaansoeke – vir prosesse wat emissies behels waar dit onwaarskynlik is dat daar op enige tydstip in die toekoms aan die emissie standarde voldoen sal kan word.

Die aansoek sal bevindinge van onafhanklik voorbereide Atmosferiese Impak Verslae in ag neem. Dit sal Sasol se impak op die omliggende lugkwaliteit in die areas wat deur hul fasilitete geraak word, aandui. Dit sal ook ander redes, soos hieronder beskryf, wat oorweging regverdig tydens besluitnemings vir uitstel en vrystelling van die MES in ag neem. Waar aansoek om uitstel gedoen word, sal Sasol substantiewe inligting voorlê, gebaseer op studies wat die owerhede in staat sal stel om alternatiewe standaarde wat aan Sasol se omliggende luggehalte impak gekoppel word, voor te skryf. Dit sal verbeterde omliggende luggehalte tot gevolg hê, gebaseer op Sasol se vermoë om aan hierdie standaarde te voldoen. Sasol sal voortgaan om verminderingsstegnologie te ondersoek met die oog op verdere verbetering van die gehalte van hul lug emissies, inlyn met hul filosofie van voortgesette verbetering van luggehalte.

Die uitstel- en vrystellingsaansoek sal afsonderlik ingedien word, aangesien dit onderhewig is aan verskillende vereistes in terme van NEM:AQA: uitstel word gereguleer onder Regulasie 6 van die MES, terwyl vrystellings in terme van Artikel 59 van die Wet gereguleer word.

Die volgende emissies word hanteer in die AIV:

- Swaweldioksied (SO₂)
- Deeltjies materie (PM)

SKOON BRANDSTOF 2

Suid-Afrika se raffinaderye is in die proses om nuwe brandstof spesifikasies te implementeer in terme van voorskrifte van die Departement van Energie. Die oogmerk met die spesifikasies is om raffinaderye sover te kry om brandstof met 'n laer koolstofinhoud te vervaardig. In die brandstofraffineringsbedryf word in die algemeen na hierdie proses verwys as Skoon Brandstof 2. Dit sal die swawelgebaseerde emissies as gevolg van die verbranding van petrol en diesel deur motors, met 98% verminder.

Om die voorgestelde spesifikasies te bereik sal Natref veranderige aan sy prosesse en aanleg moet aanbring, wat 'n invloed op die puntbron emissies mag hê. Verdere inligting oor die wyse waarop emissies beïnvloed sal word, sal in die motiveringdokument verskaf word.

NATREF SE REDES VIR GESELEKTEERDE UITSTEL- EN VRYSTELLINGSAANSOEKE

Daar is verskeie redes, insluitend dié hieronder gelys, wat die vermindering van emissievlekke soos voorgeskryf in die voldoeningstydraamwerke van die MES moeilik bereikbaar maak in sommige gevalle, en redelik onprakties in ander gevalle. Hierdie redes sal vir elke proses gespesifiseer word in die motivering vir uitstel en vrystelling wat onderskeidelik aan die Nasionale Luggehalte Beample en die Minister voorgelê sal word.

- **Holistiese saak vir puntbronvermindering** – Natref se voortgesette assessering van die kwessie van luggehalte in en om sy aanlegte, duï daarop dat die MES nie noodwendig beduidende verbeterings in omliggende luggehalte sal lewer nie, as gevolg van die materiële impak van aktiwiteite soos die huishoudelike brand van steenkool en hout, wat die besoedelingskonsentrate gedurende die wintermaande verhoog. Dit is dus onwaarskynlik dat hoë finansiële terreininsette enige wesenlike verbeterings in swak luggehalte in die Vaal Driehoek prioriteitsareas, waarin Natref hul aanlegte bedryf, tot gevolg sal hê. Omgewingsbestuur moet geïntegreer word, en daar moet besef word dat alle omgewingselemente gekoppel en interafhanklik van mekaar is. Die effek van die besluite rakende alle aspekte van die omgewing, moet in berekening gebring word deur die kies van die "mees praktiese omgewingsoplossings", wat die opsies is wat die meeste voordele bring en wat die minste skade aan die omgewing as 'n geheel berokken, teen 'n koste wat vir die samelewing aanvaarbaar is.
- **Geïntegreerde voordele van die Skoon Brandstof 2 program** – die skoon Brandstof 2 program, afgesien van ander voordele, verminder swaweldioksied, deeltjies materie en stikstofoksied emissies van voertuig uitlaatpype, wat 'n voordelige uitwerking op omliggende luggehalte in stedelike gebiede sal hê. Deur emissies uit voertuig uitlaatpype te verminder sal emissies uit die skoorstene van raffinaderye verhoog word. Uit 'n netto impak perspektief sal omliggende luggehalte steeds beter wees as 'n resultaat van Skoon Brandstof 2.

- **Omgewings onderhandelingsmeganismes** – Verbeterings in luggehalte verg dikwels verhandelings wat ander negatiewe omgewingsresultate impliseer en moet daarom deegliker in die konteks van geïntegreerde omgewingsbestuur oorweeg word. Omdat Natref 'n binnelandse raffinadery is, moet sy afvloeiwatert in varswaterbronne gestort word teenoor raffinaderye aan die kus wat afvloeiwatert in die see stort. Verdere vermindering van swaweldioksied emissies sal verhoogde vlakke van afval of vaste afval veroorsaak. Dit is teenstrydig met die nasionale beleid in verband met water- en afvalbestuur en bring onbedoelde omgewingsimpakte mee, wat gebalanseer moet word met doelwitte rakende luggehalte.
- **Ruimte Beperkings** – Die ruimte wat by Natref se fasilitet beskikbaar is, is oor dekades van bedryf, uitbreidings en verbeterings geoptimaliseer. Dit beteken dat in sekere gevalle daar baie min plek is vir die aanbring van groot addisionele verminderingsinstallasies. Volledige voldoening aan die MES sal vereis dat dele van die aanleg gesluit en geskuif sal moet word na 'n nuwe terrein of in geheel vervang sal moet word. Dit sal uiterst duur opgraderings by bestaande aanlegte tot gevolg hê.
- **Finansiëel** – Natref word bedryf in 'n gereguleerde prysmark. Sonder kosteverhaling om verminderingsstegnologie by Natref se bestaande fasilitete te implementeer ten einde aan nuwe aanlegstandaarde te voldoen, sal die oorblywende ekonomiese leeftyd van die aanleg direk beïnvloed word. Die sosio-ekonomiese gevolge van hierdie vereiste moet in ag geneem word.
- **Hertoerusting van bestaande aanlegte tot nuwe standaarde** – As gevolg van verskille in bestuur en ontwerp in ou toerusting, is dit moontlik dat standaardtoerusting wat in nuwer aanlegte geïnstalleer word, nie op dieselfde vlakke sal presteer wanneer dit by bestaande aanlegte geïnstalleer word nie,
- **Projek implementeringstydraamwerke** – Die uitvoer van grootskaalse kapitale projekte, soos vereis vir voldoening aan die MES, impliseer lang tydperke voor dit voltooi is. In dieselfde tydperk sal van Natref verwag word om grootskaalse kapitaalprojekte met die oog op die Skoon Brandstof 2 verpligtinge aan te gaan. Die vereiste om veranderings in dieselfde tydsperiode aan te bring, sal druk uitoefen op projekbronne en beskikbaarheid van bronne. Dit kan verder ook binnelandse brandstofsekuriteit in gevaar stel. Om Skoon Brandstof 2 in dieselfde tyd as MES te implementer, lyk nie haalbaar nie.

Betrokke en geaffekteerde partye sal gedurende die openbare deelnameproses die geleentheid gebied word om kommentaar te lewer op die konsep motiveringsverslae, rakende hierdie aspekte van die aansoek.



Reaksies van belanghebbendes wat tydens die openbare deelnameproses geopper word, sal saam met die Motiveringsverslag ingedien word.

Die voorgestelde tegniese en openbare deelname aktiwiteite, sowel as die breë tydsraamwerk vir die proses word hieronder geïllustreer.





The musical depicts the journey travelled by many Evaton citizens who saw the area grow from Wildebeesfontein farm to what it is today.


