1 Introduction

Sasol South Africa (Pty) Ltd (Sasol) is an international integrated chemicals and energy company that leverages technologies and the expertise of 30100 people working in 33 countries. Sasol develops and commercialises technologies, and builds and operates world-scale facilities to produce a range of high-value product streams, including liquid fuels, chemicals and low-carbon electricity. Sasol is a significant business partner in the South African economy and has manufacturing operations located predominantly in Secunda, Mpumalanga and Sasolburg, Free State.

This postponement application pertains to the Sasolburg Operations (SO) in the Free State Province. Activities at the Sasolburg complex are conducted by:

- Sasol Mining (Proprietary) Limited, which mines the utilities coal used at SO.
- Sasol South Africa (Pty) Limited, operating through its Sasolburg Operations, including the entity formerly known as Sasol Infrachem (“Sasol Infrachem”) which entity supplies utilities and reformed gas for production of chemicals to Sasol-related entities and third parties.

Between 2013 and 2014 SO, through the entity formerly known as Sasol Infrachem, undertook a process to apply for postponements from the 2015 compliance timeframes of the Minimum Emissions Standards (MES) which were published in Government Notice No. 893 in Government Gazette 37054 of 22 November 2013 (“GN 893”), in terms of the National Environmental Management: Air Quality Act (Act No. 39 of 2004) (NEM:AQA) hereafter referred to as the “2014 Postponement Application”.

Following the 2014 Postponement Application, SO was granted postponement by the National Air Quality Officer (NAQO) with the concurrence of the licensing officer for a number of the activities conducted on the SO site.

In some instances, and for some sources, extended compliance timeframes were granted however for other sources less than the five years was granted as initially requested. SO therefore is making an application for further postponements from the 2015 existing plant standards for the Heavy Ends B (B6990), High sulphur pitch (B6930) and Spent caustic (B6993) Incinerators at its Thermal Oxidation plant (the “2017 Postponement Application”). In addition, since the five-year postponement periods being extended will extend beyond 1 April 2020, postponements on the associated 2020 new plant standards, which will come into effect on that date, are also applied for.

Sasol’s application includes the findings of an independently prepared Atmospheric Impact Report (AIR), which determines Sasol’s impact on ambient air quality, along with further reasons that warrant consideration in a decision about postponements from the MES. Sasol has appointed Airshed Planning Professionals (Airshed) to prepare the AIR and SRK Consulting (South Africa) (Pty) Ltd. (SRK) to manage the technical studies and the Public Participation Process (PPP).

1.1 Scope of this report

This report documents the public participation activities undertaken during the announcement phase, the process whereby Interested and Affected Parties (I&APs) were provided the opportunity to comment on the Draft Motivation Report and AIR prepared as part of the application and documents any comments received and associated responses given.

2 Approach to Public Participation

The PPP undertaken as part of Sasol’s application for postponement of the compliance timeframes is structured to meet the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations (Government Notice No. 982, 04 December 2014) published under the National Environmental Management Act (Act 107 of 1998) (NEMA), as specified in the November 2013 MES Regulations.




Figure 2-1: Technical and Public Participation Process

The PPP is an important component of the application and is closely linked to the technical activities required for the preparation of the Motivation Report. **Figure 2-1** details the Technical and Public Participation processes.

3 I&AP Identification

I&APs were identified as follows:

- Identified from previous environmental authorisation processes undertaken by SRK.
- Registered with the previous Sasol postponement applications.
- Registered at any of the bi-annual Sasol environmental/health consultation sessions on air quality matters.
- Registered with the Offset Implementation Plan public participation process.

The I&AP database for the SO comprises approximately 1140 I&APs, representing various sectors of society as listed below (Refer to **Appendix 1** for the full database of I&APs):

- National government: The Department of Environmental Affairs, Department of Mineral Resources and the Department of Water and Sanitation.
- Provincial government: The Free State Department of Economic, Small Business Development, Tourism and Environmental Affairs, Department of Health and Social Development, Department of Water and Sanitation and the South African Local Government Association.
- District and local government: Fezile Dabi District Municipality, Metsimaholo Local Municipality and their ward councillors.
- NGOs and interest groups: Such as Save the Vaal Environment, the Vaal Environmental Alliance (VEJA), Wildlife and Environment Society of South Africa, Legal Resources Centre (LRC), Centre for Environmental Rights and GroundWork.
- Organised business and commerce: Business Unity South Africa.
- Organised mining and industry: Chamber of Mines and Harmony Gold Mines.
- Community based organisations: Sasol Community Working Group.
- Labour unions and associations: Transvaal Agricultural Union, National Education Health and Allied Workers' Union and The Chemical Energy Paper Printing Wood and Allied Workers Union.
- Research and academia: Council for Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR), and Infotox.
- Media: Sedibeng Ster, Vaal Weekblad.
- Parastatals: Eskom, Transnet, Telkom, South African Heritage Resource Agency, and the South African National Biodiversity Institute.
- Sasol employees (internal I&APs).
- Adjacent and surrounding landowners.

The database was reviewed and updated during the PPP.

4 Project Announcement

The project announcement phase was conducted between 16 November 2016 and 09 December 2016. I&APs received notification of Sasol's intention to apply for postponement, a Background Information Document (BID) and an invitation to register as an I&AP in the process. I&APs were invited to participate in the process as follows:

- Distribution by email, of invitation letters accompanied by a BID and a registration and comment form on 16 November 2016 (see **Appendix B and C** for copies of these documents).
- Advertisements were placed in three local newspapers (see **Appendix D** for proof of advertisement publication), as follows:
 - Vaal Weekblad (Afrikaans) on Wednesday 16 November 2016.
 - Puisano News (Sesotho) on Wednesday 23 November 2016.
 - Sasolburg Ster (English) on Wednesday 16 November 2016.
- Site notices (A2 Size), in English, Afrikaans and Sotho together with copies of the BIDs and registration and comment forms were placed in publically accessible venues in close proximity to the operations, namely the Sasolburg Public Library, Zamdela Library, Metsimaholo Local Municipality and at the SO Site Reception on 16 November 2016 (see **Appendix E** for a copy of the site notice and photographs indicating notice placement).
- BIDs, invitation letters and registration and comment forms were placed on SRK's website at <http://www.srk.co.za/en/za-sasol2018postponement>.
- Where email addresses for I&APs weren't available, facsimile and SMS notification were made to I&APs to inform them of postponement application.

5 Public comment on the Draft Motivation Report and AIR

The Draft Motivation Report and AIR were made available for public comment for a period of 30 days from **6 February to 8 March 2017**. Notification of the availability of the documents and an invitation to attend the public meetings to facilitate comment on the Draft Motivation Report and AIR was made as follows:

- Distribution by email of notification letters between **6-8 February 2017 (Appendix B)**.
- Advertisements in local newspapers, as follows (see **Appendix D** for proof of advertisement publication):
 - Vaal Weekblad (Afrikaans) **8-10 February 2017**.

 - Sasolburg Ster (English) **7 – 13 February 2017**.

The primary objectives of the public meetings were to:

- Foster engagements and build trust relationships with host communities.
- Share information on Natref, its activities and Air Quality impacts relating to the postponement application.
- Provide an opportunity for the community to participate in and raise any issues regarding the postponement application process.
- Facilitate comments on the Motivation Report and AIR.

All comments raised at the public meetings are captured in the CRR included as Annexure D of the Motivation Report.

5.2 Follow up with I&APs

Due to the level of attendance at the public meetings reminder emails were sent to all I&APs with email addresses (Appendix B). The letter guided I&APs to a copy of the public meeting presentation that was made available on the SRK website at <http://www.srk.co.za/en/za-sasol2017postponement>. SRK also undertook telephonic follow up with key I&APs to elicit comment.

5.3 Comments Received

To date, SRK have received requests for I&APs to be registered on the database as well as requests from some I&APs to be removed from the database. Other than requests for registration and issues raised at the public meeting, the only comment received was from the Department of Water and Sanitation regarding how these applications would impact on the Water Use Licence for the site.

All comments received on the Draft Motivation Report or AIR either at public meetings or via post, email or fax, including responses thereto as appropriate, have been included in a CRR (Annexure D of the Motivation Report). The CRR will be submitted with the Motivation Report and AIR to the NAQO for consideration.

Comments received via post, email, fax or the online comment form are attached as Annexure 1 of the Comments and Response Report.

INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this document is to provide stakeholders with the following:

- Information on the background to Sasol's applications for postponements from certain of the requirements of the Minimum Emission Standards (MES) (published in GNR No. 893 of 22 November 2013) published in terms of section 21 of the National Environmental Management: Air Quality Act 39 of 2004 ("NEMAQA") for some of Sasol's operations in Secunda and Sasolburg (The location of these facilities is indicated on pages 3).
- An outline of the legal framework governing air quality management in South Africa and specifically the MES, pertinent to this BID and related applications.
- Information on the stakeholder engagement and application process that will be followed.
- Information regarding opportunities to provide comments relating to the applications.

BACKGROUND

Sasol is an international integrated chemicals and energy company that leverages technologies and the expertise of 30 100 people working in 33 countries. Sasol develops and commercialises technologies, and builds and operates world-scale facilities to produce a range of high-value product streams, including liquid fuels, chemicals and low-carbon electricity. Sasol is a significant business partner in the South African economy and has manufacturing operations located predominantly in Secunda, Mpumalanga and Sasolburg, Free State.¹

Sasol is committed to growing its business for the long term in a safe, ethical, compliant and environmentally responsible way, consistent with its Safety, Health & Environment policy and Sasol values. AIR QUALITY MANAGEMENT

The term “ambient air quality” refers to the state of the air in our surrounding environment. Good air quality is important not only for humans, but for other organisms and the environment in general. Poor air quality is a result of a number of factors, including emissions from various sources, both natural (such as veld fires) and human-induced (industrial and domestic emissions).

The role of the regulatory authorities is to ensure that ambient air quality meets standards set to protect human health and the environment. In order to achieve this, the Department of Environmental Affairs has promulgated two related but distinct standards. The first are referred to as point source emission standards (also called Minimum Emission Standards (MES)), which place limits on the concentration of emissions from certain industrial activities. These are contained in the MES. The second are ambient air quality standards which seek to set total emissions from all contributors (i.e. industry, citizens and natural causes) to a level that protects human health and the environment.



Sasol’s approach to air quality management is well aligned with the risk-based philosophy adopted by the ambient air quality standards.

Sasol monitors the total quality of ambient air near its facilities through a network of accredited monitoring stations. It also prepares dispersion model scenarios to understand its impacts on ambient air quality in the regions in which it operates, and its capacity to improve these outcomes with point source emission reduction technologies e.g. electrostatic precipitators for particulate matter. This is contextualised against the backdrop of other sources of ambient air pollution, to identify the most effective actions to achieve ambient air quality improvements. This approach helps to inform Sasol’s air quality management priorities, by identifying the key actions to effectively improve ambient air quality.

LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

NEM:AQA provides for various specific air quality management measures. These include the declaration of priority areas such as the Vaal Triangle Priority Area and the Highveld Priority Area, ambient air quality standards and point source emission standards as regulated in the MES. The MES prescribe the limits for point source emissions from existing plants which became effective from 1 April 2015 (the so-called ‘existing plant standards’) and which Sasol has previously made application for postponement for as mentioned below, as well as more stringent limits that must be met by 1 April 2020 (the so-called ‘new plant standards’) (termed “Compliance Timeframes”). Part 2 of the MES allows for applications for postponements of the prescribed compliance timeframes. Postponement applications must be made to the National Air Quality Officer at the Department of Environmental Affairs.


As part of its application, Sasol is required to submit an Atmospheric Impact Report (AIR) and supported by detailed justification and reasons. The MES also require that Sasol make these documents available for public comment as prescribed in Chapter 6 of the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations GN R982 (2014) promulgated under the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act No. 107 of 1998) (NEMA).

Between 2013 and 2014 Sasol undertook a process to apply for postponements from the 2015 compliance timeframes of the MES. Sasol was granted postponements for a number of its operations by the National Air Quality Officer (NAQO), with the concurrence of its licensing officer. However Sasol will be unable, in certain instances, to timeously meet the compliance requirements of the 2015 MES where postponements have been granted for less than five years, as initially requested.

Sasol has spent approximately R2 billion per year over the past decade on environmental improvement projects, most of which has been focused on air quality improvement.

For the next decade, Sasol has outlined a committed roadmap which informs progressive improvements to its existing facilities which will enable a sustainable transition toward meeting the stringent standards set for new plants, under the MES.



- Only persons who are eighteen [18] years and older or who own a business or property in the ward will have the right to nominate candidates for the ward committee of that ward,
- Be registered and appear on the IEC voters roll for the ward where the person is being nominated to be a ward committee member,
- For any person to be elected into or serve in a Ward Committee, one should not be permanently or contractually employed by a Municipality,

No adjustment will be made to the salaries of:

- All members of National Parliament
- All members of Provincial Executive and Legislature
- All Judges
- Local Government: Positions of Executive Mayor to Whip
- Traditional Leadership: Position of the King/Queen to Full-time Deputy Chairperson of Provincial House of Traditional Leaders

Briefing media in Pretoria on Friday on the 2016/17 Annual Remuneration Recommendations for POBs, the commission's Deputy Chairperson, Matshego Ramagaga, said the recommendations were made after courtesy consultations with the Ministers of Finance and Justice and Correctional Services, the Chief Justice, the Lower Courts Remuneration Committee and the Minister of Cooperative Governance and Traditional Affairs.

The Minister of Finance expressed serious concern regarding the state of the South African economy, increasing constraints on the fiscus, inflationary increases and the available resources of the state.

Ramagaga said the commission considered, in compliance with Section 8(6) of the Commission Act, factors including the role, status, duties and responsibilities of the POBs concerned; the affordability of different levels of remuneration of public office bearers; inflationary increases;

current principles and levels of remuneration, particularly in respect of the organs as well as the available resources of the state.

The commission, however, recommended a 4% cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) for municipal councillors; 6% for all magistrates and full-time members of the National House of Traditional leaders (NHTL) and headmen/headwomen, and sitting allowances for all members of NHTL

and Provincial House of Traditional leaders.

Once-off gratuity payment

The commission recommended that only non-returning municipal councillors, who served for a minimum period of 24 consecutive months prior to the 3 August 2016 Local Government Elections, qualify to receive the once-off gratuity payment. The once-off gratuity payment must be paid based on the basic salary and not the annual total remuneration package "because the

employer's contributions towards the benefit funds are included in the total package", Ramagaga said.

The 2016/17 recommendations were submitted to President Jacob Zuma on 18 October and to the National Parliament on 3 November 2016. They were published in Government Gazette No 40422 on 11 November 2016 and also uploaded in the commission's website. – SAnews.gov.za

WARNING - Vehicle owners selling privately

Sasolburg: The police in Sasolburg would like to warn vehicle owners who are trying to sell their vehicles privately on social media to be careful of fraudulent buyers. Several cases has been reported where vehicle owners would advertise a vehicle for sale on social medias and an interested individual would contact the seller and arrange for a test drive of the vehicle. After the test drive is complete the potential buyer would inform the

seller that he is willing to buy the vehicle and the owner should give him bank details so that the money can be transferred electronically. The money is then transferred to the sellers bank account, the seller will receive an sms from the bank confirming this, then the seller will hand over the vehicle to the buyer. Few minutes after the buyer has left with the vehicle and the vehicles registration papers the seller will receive an sms from the bank notifying

him of the reversal of the payment. At this stage it is too late to stop the buyer as he has already driven away with the vehicle. The police are warning vehicle owners not to hand over the vehicle before they are sure that the amount is in the bank and cannot be reversed by the person who deposited the money. They can also request a copy of an identification document as well as proof of residence from the seller so that the person can be traceable.

Zamdela : The police in Zamdela are searching for three suspects of business robbery. It is alleged that on Monday 14 November 2016 at about 18:10 the complainant was busy performing his duties selling to his customers at Dusty Shop near Taylor Park. 


Plate 1: Metsimaholo Local Municipality




Plate 2: Sasolburg Public Library




Plate 3: Zamdela Public Library




Plate 4: Sasolburg Operations Site Reception
